


## **BUILD A TABLE**





Ask an adult to help you cut out the images below. Then fold the white flap behind each item. This will allow each item to stand on its own. You can also affix a piece of tape to the white flap of each item to stabilize it.




## MORE KITCHEN SUPPLIES




Ask an adult to help you cut out the images below. Then create each box by folding in the flaps. You can use a piece of tape to secure each box.




